Abbreviations:

BB = Bodlondeb buoy (green buoy on the seaward side of Bodlondeb point)

CC = Conwy cob buoy (yellow buoy off the Cob)

P = Perch D = Deganwy

T = Tunnel mark (yellow buoy off the seaward end of the tunnel bund Deganwy side of the river)

CM = Club mark

WS = West shore mark (yellow buoy off the West Shore cafe)

PI = Puffin Island

FB = Ten Foot Bank Buoy

SL = Starting Line

FLc = Finishing Line

FL2 = Finish line between C2 and C1. Yachts must cross the finish line within 5 boat lengths of C2

FLf = Fairway finish line – a line between the Fairway Buoy and C2. Yachts must cross the finish line within 5 boat lengths of C2

Note that the North Deep marks have been moved to the new channel (2016).

Radio channel for Dayboats/CODs - M2 (P4)

ChCo means 'Pass to seaward of the Perch and then between all paired channel buoys leaving all other channel marks on the correct side according to direction of travel (ie into or out of the estuary)'.
